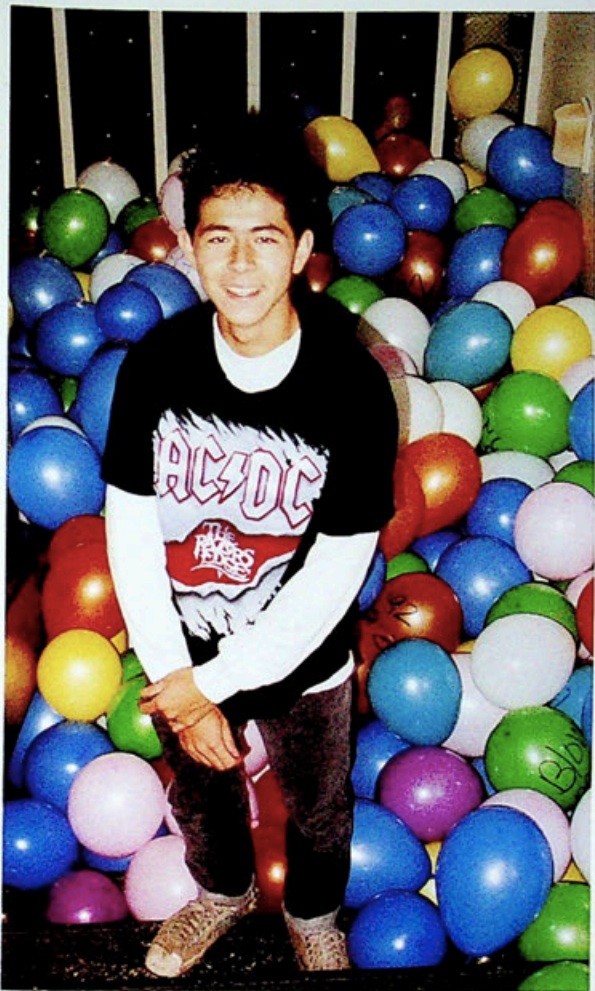

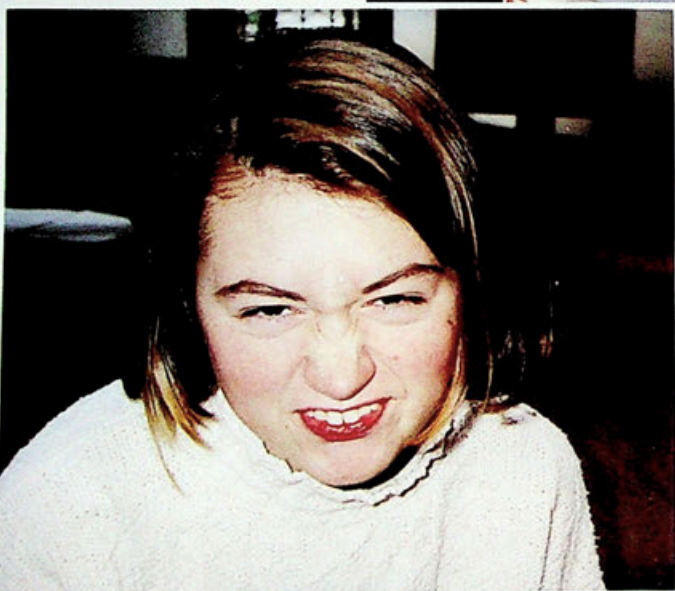

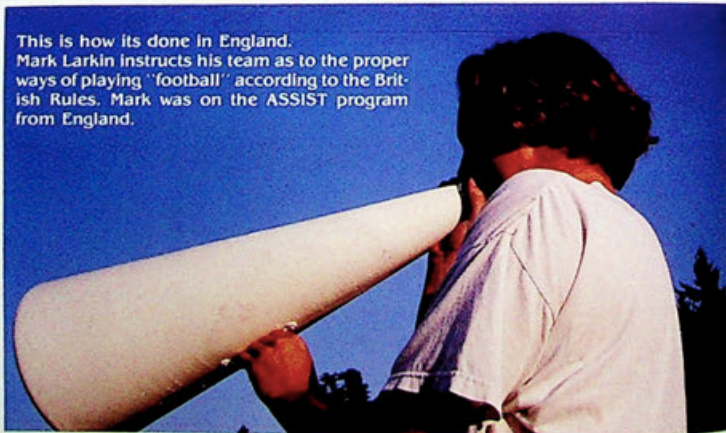

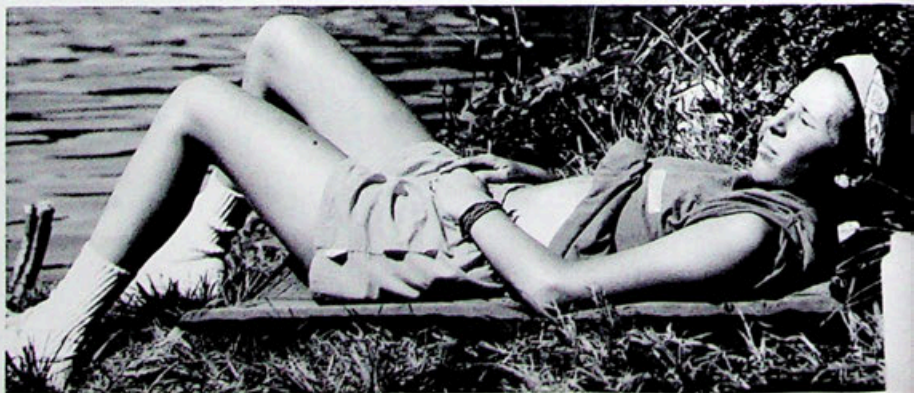

Despite all of that, the freshmen actually had fun-playing in the sun and sleeping in co-ed cabins-Hmm. The

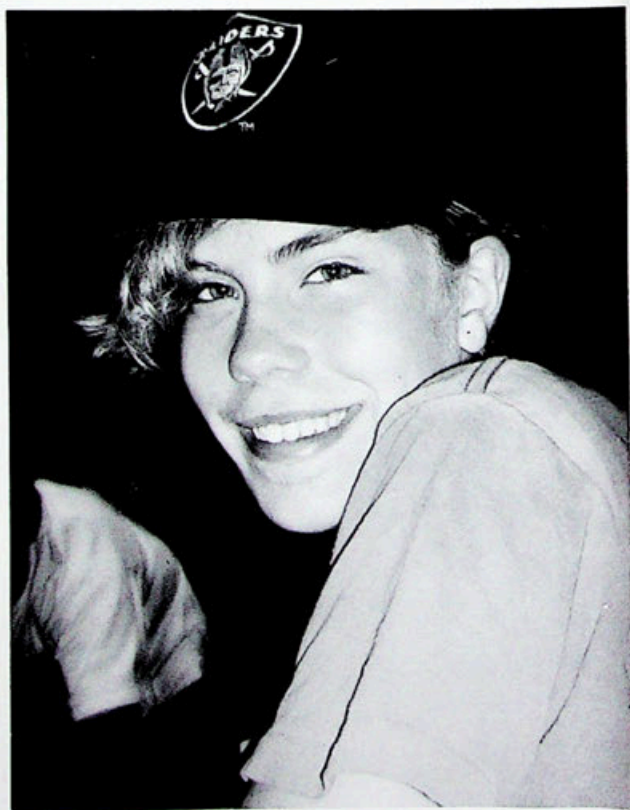

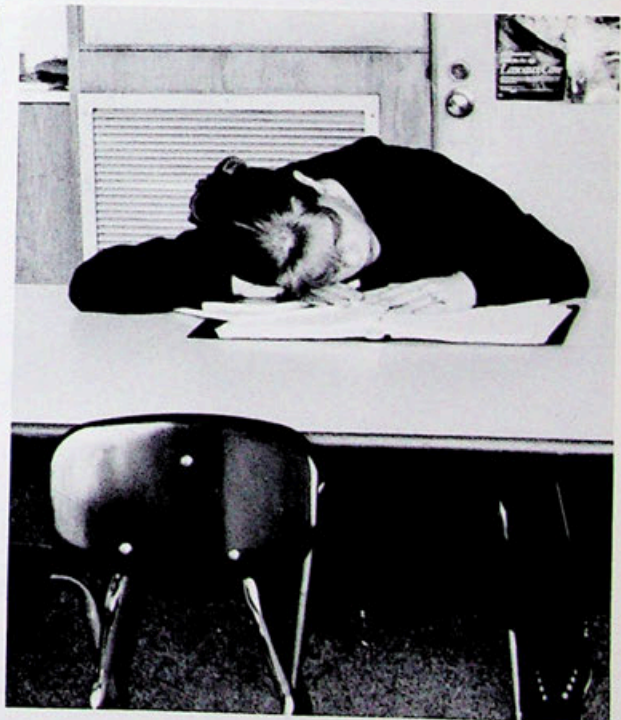

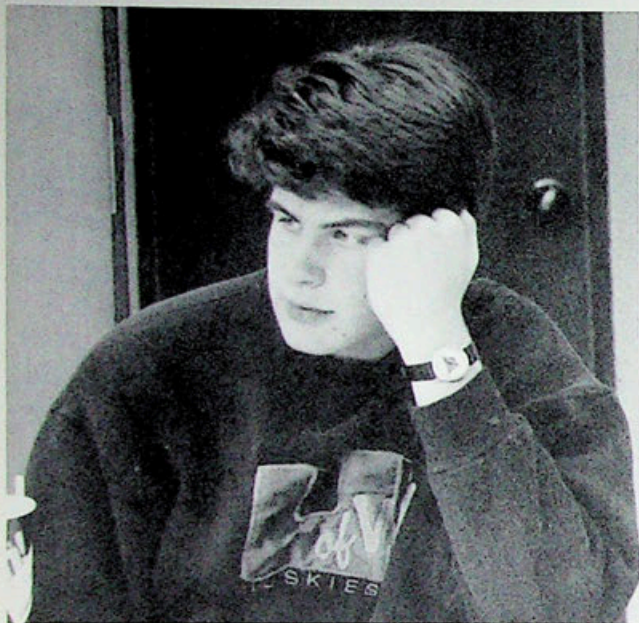

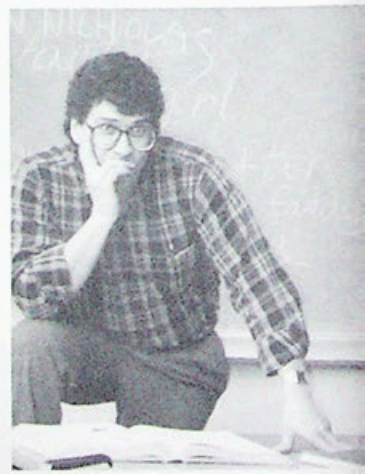

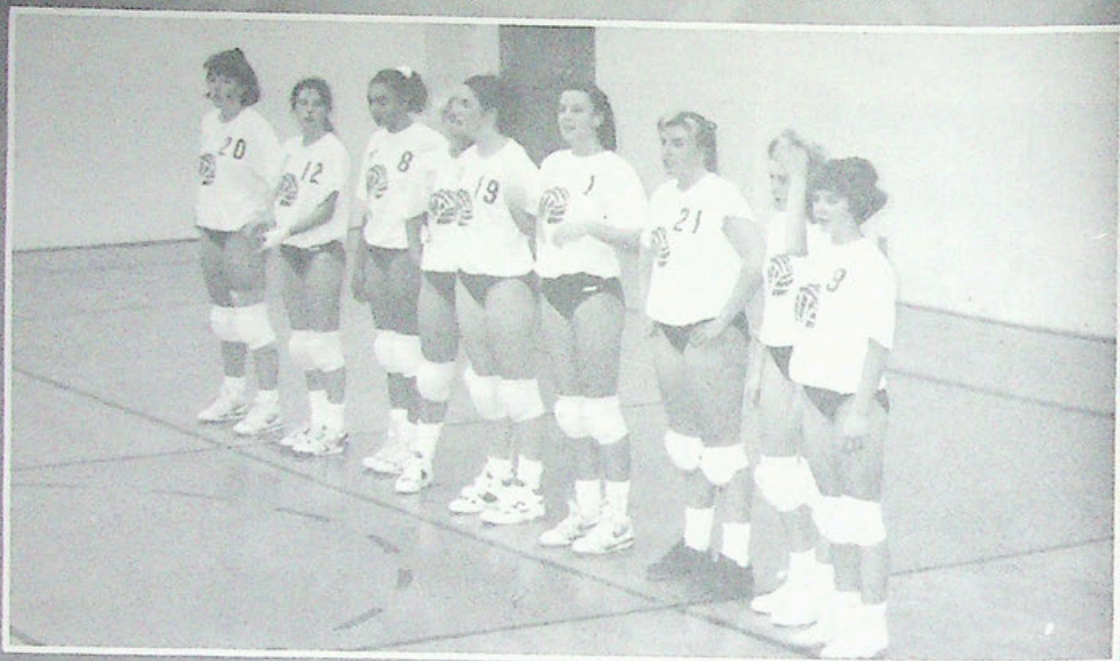

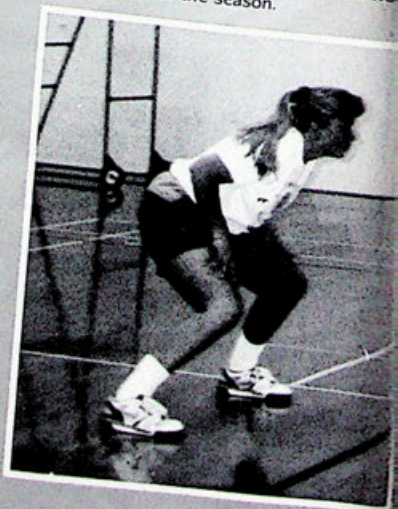

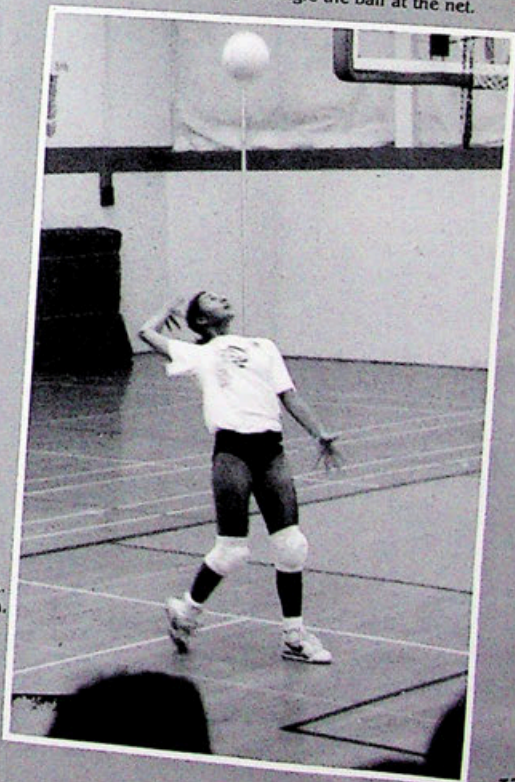

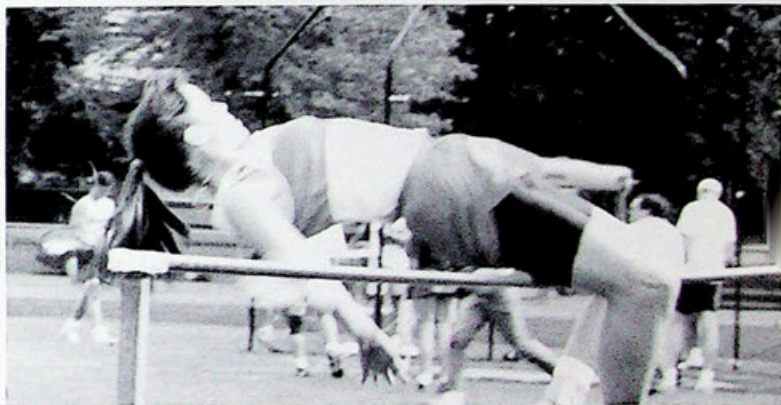

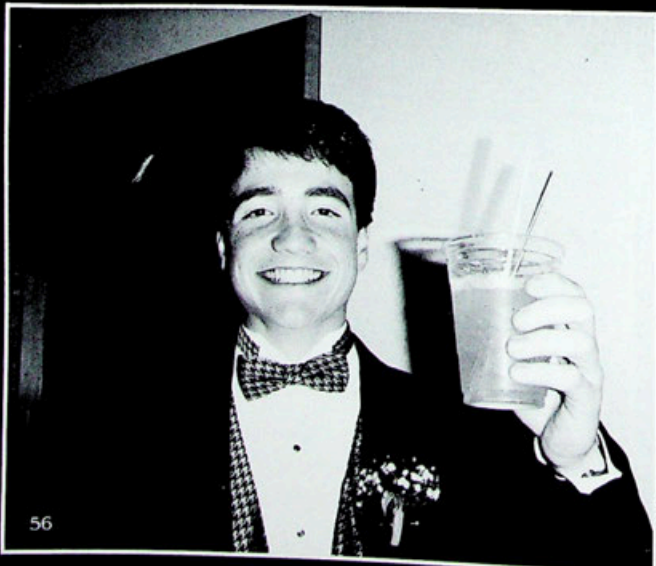

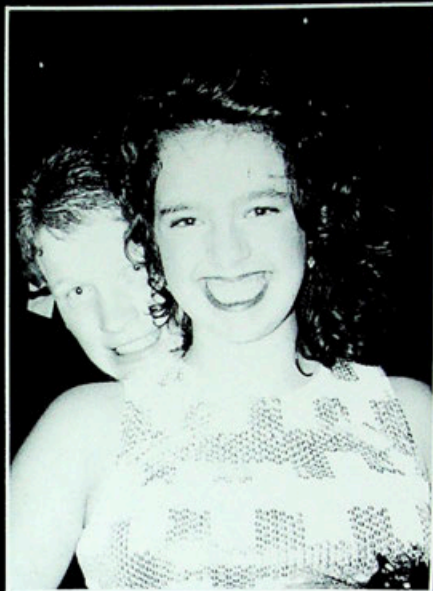

Tell Me That You Love Me Junie Moon

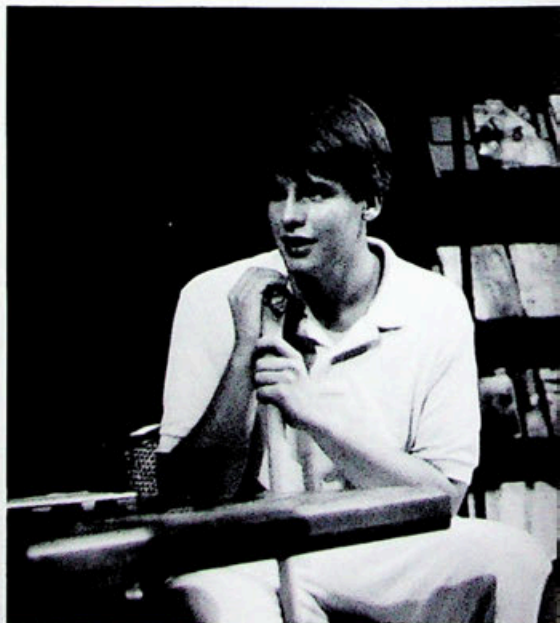

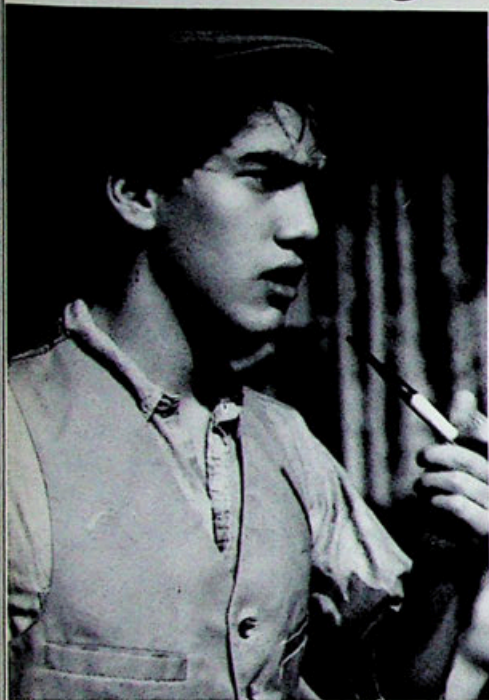

Something marvelous is afoot at OES

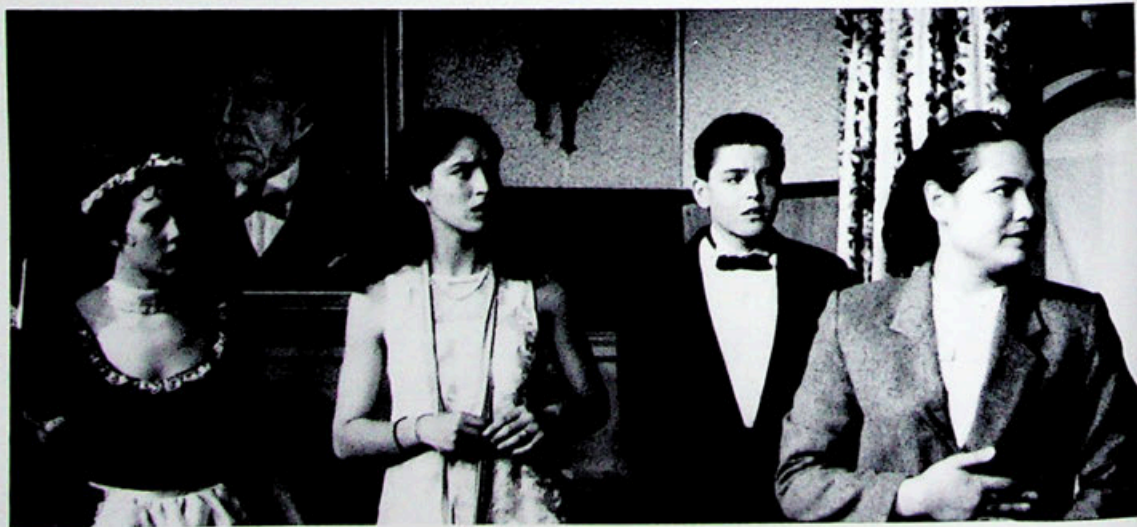

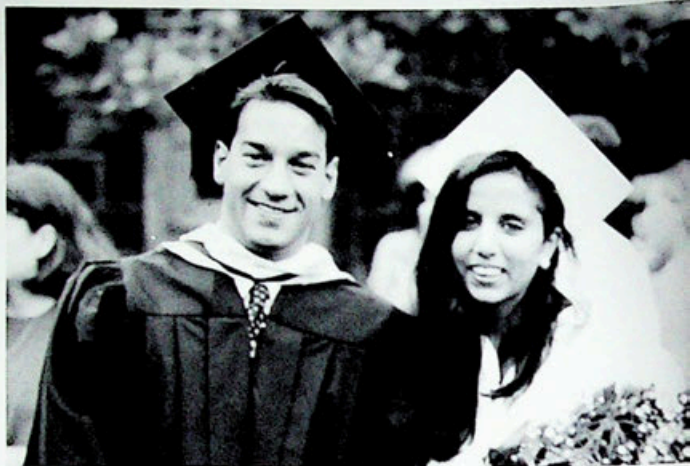
Lights! Camera! Graduation!
