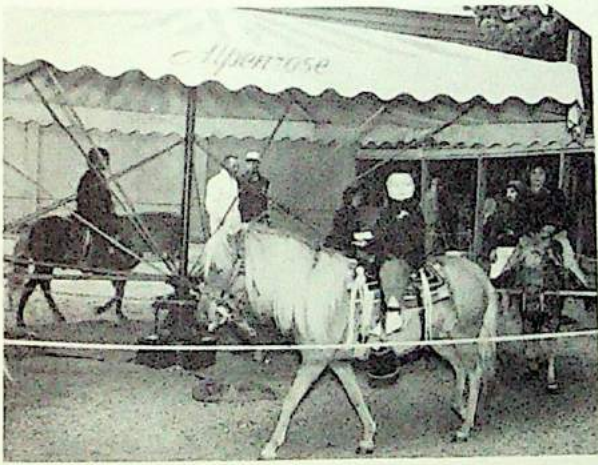


May Fete
