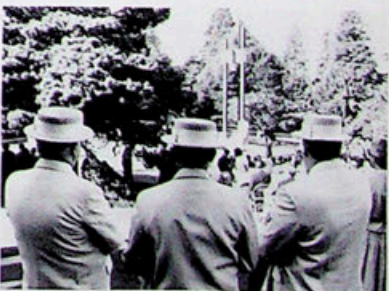
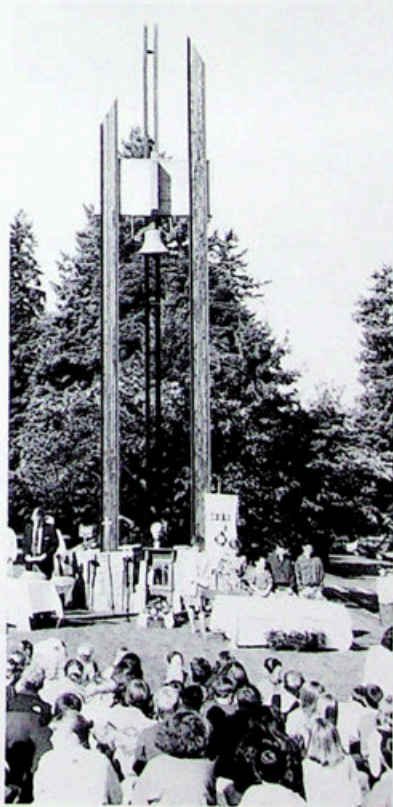


Happy 125th OES!

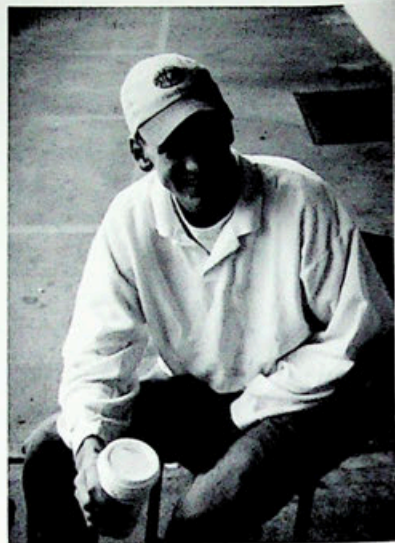

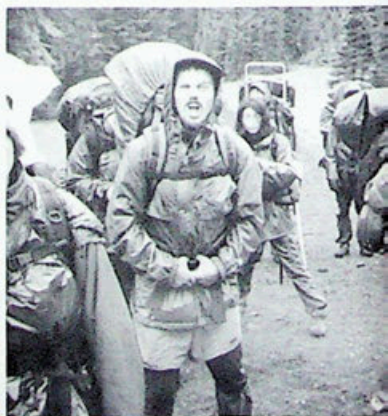

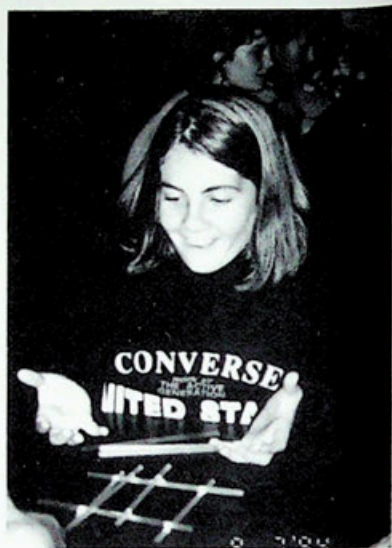
Escape to the ocean

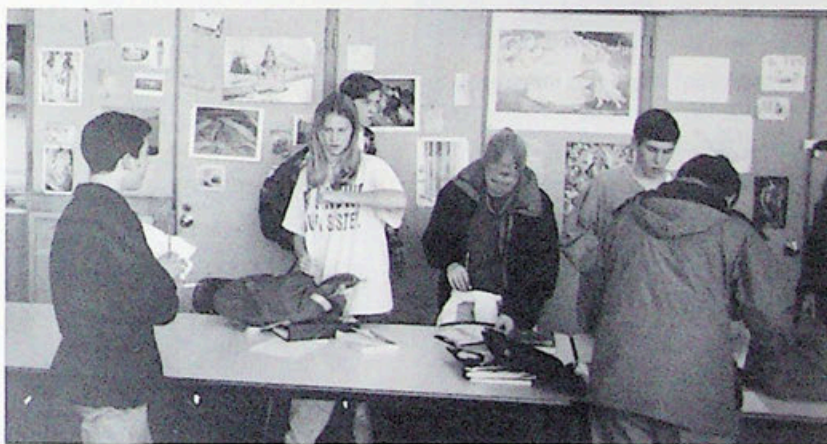

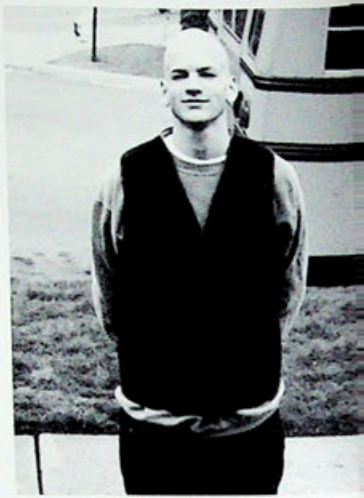

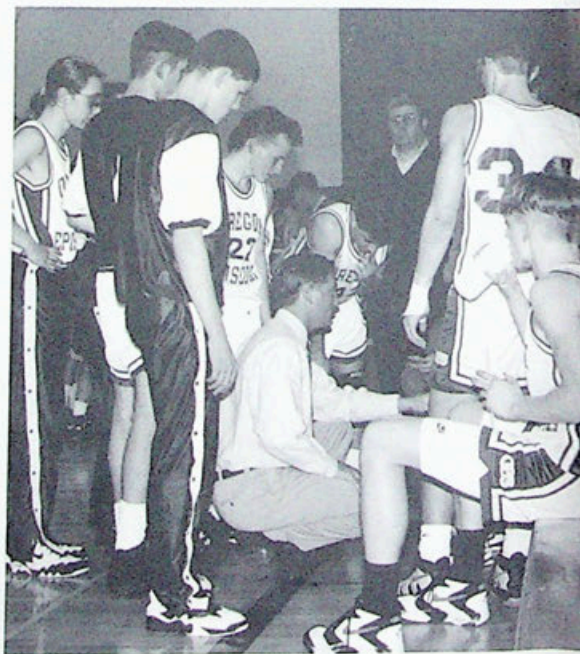

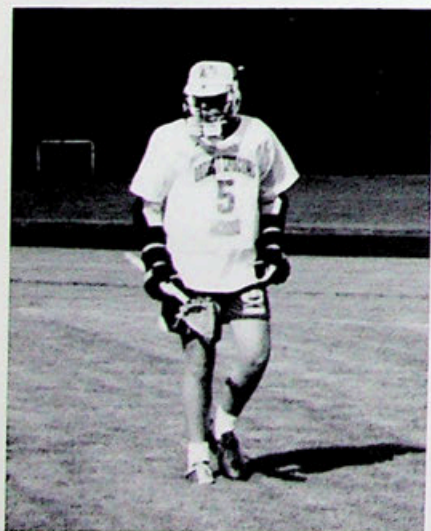

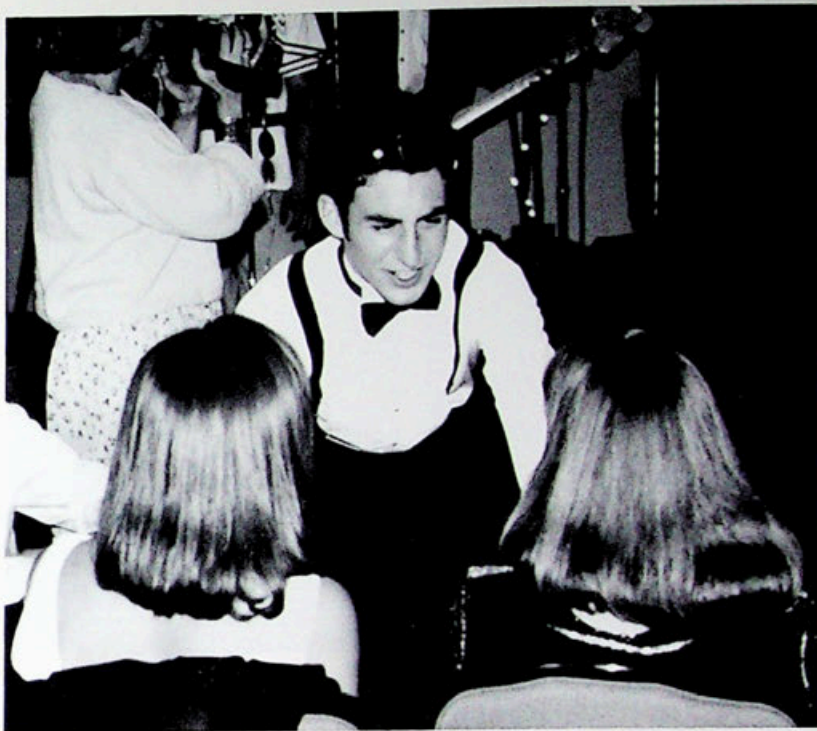
