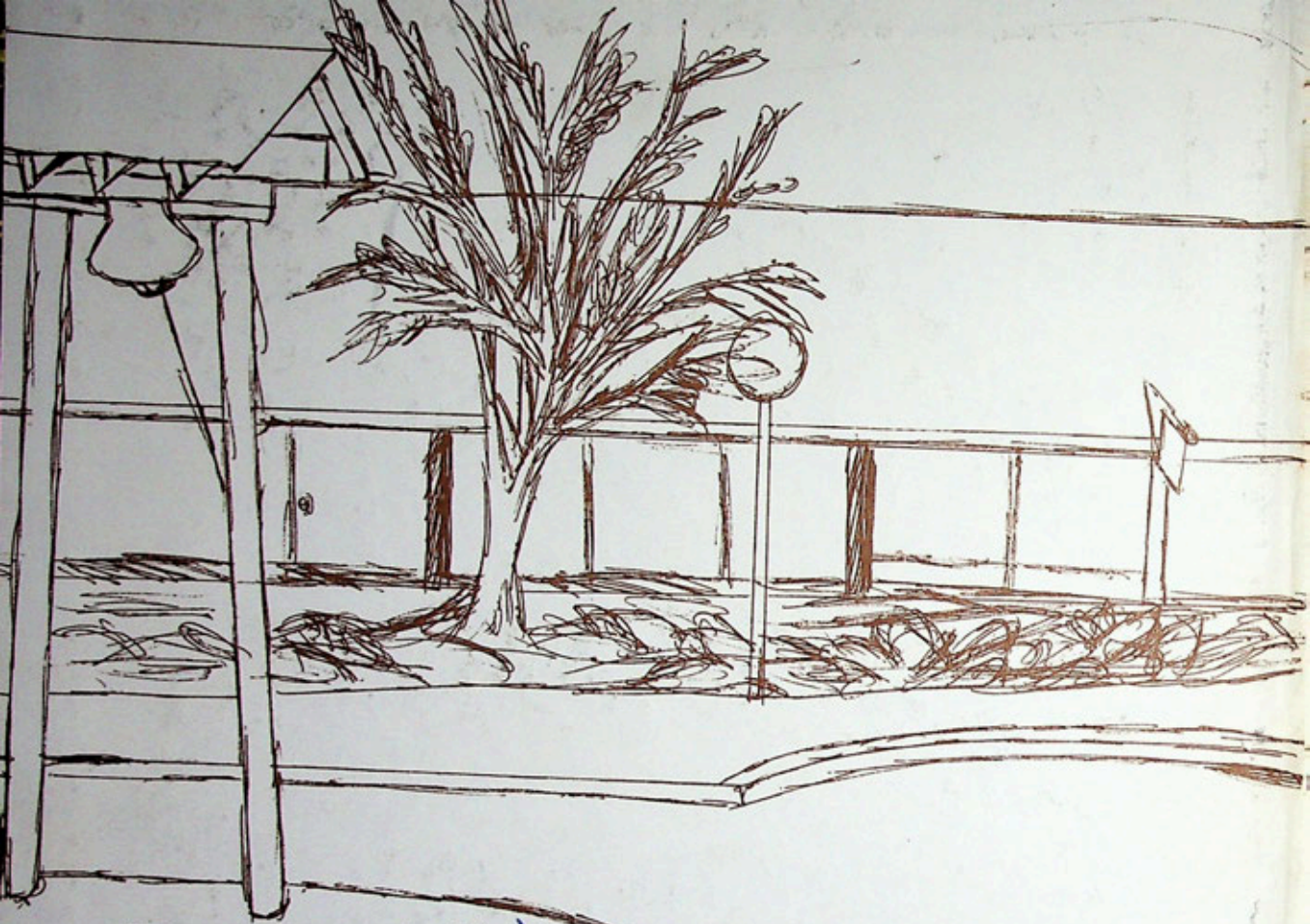




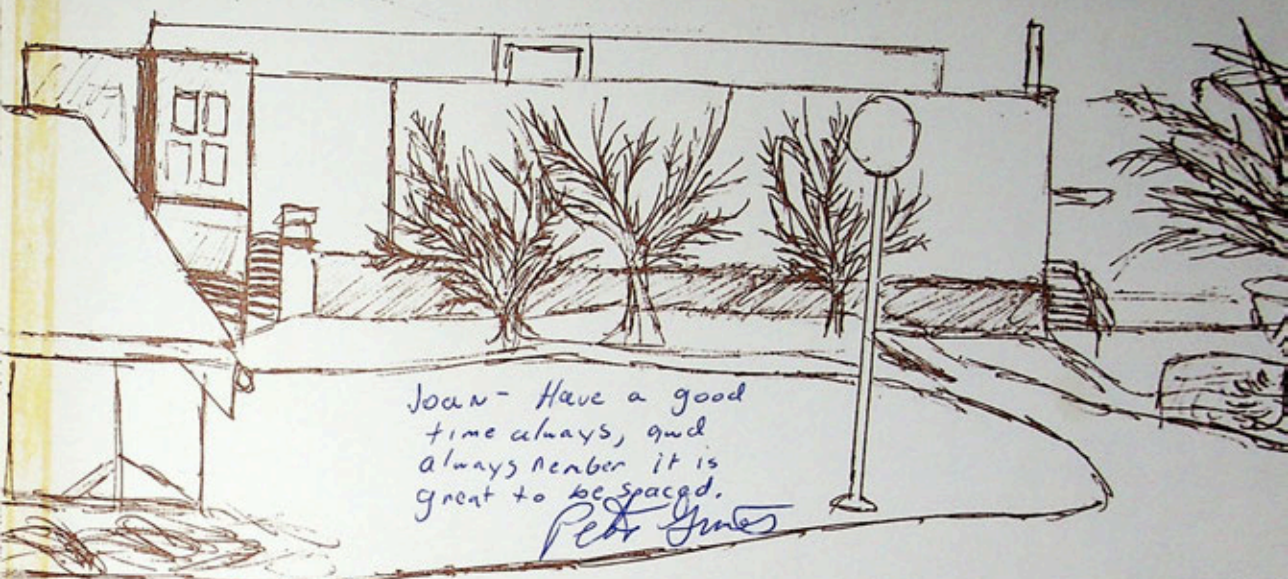

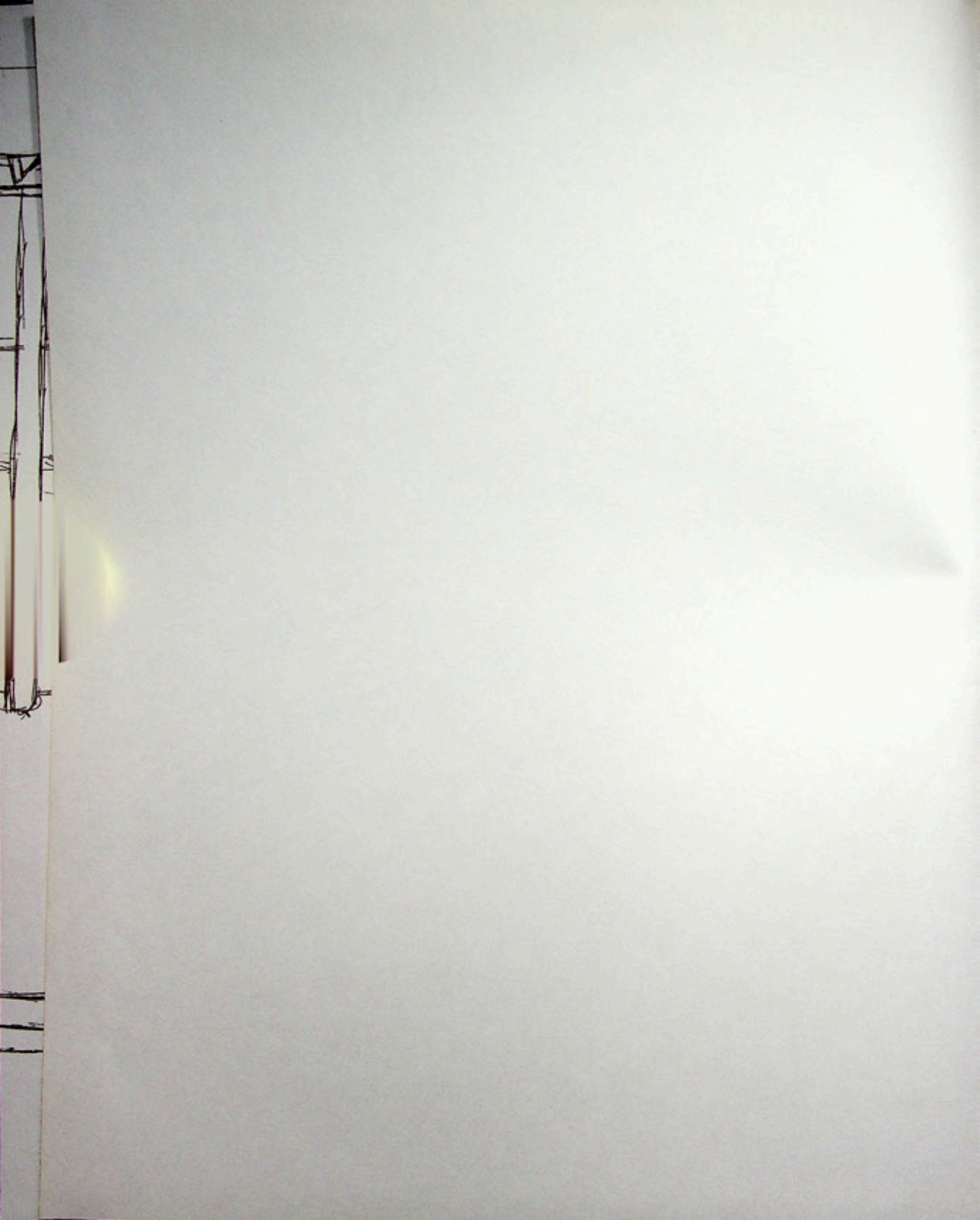

The photographers can count on his insistant suggestions for a photo display so that he won't get stuck with doing one himself.

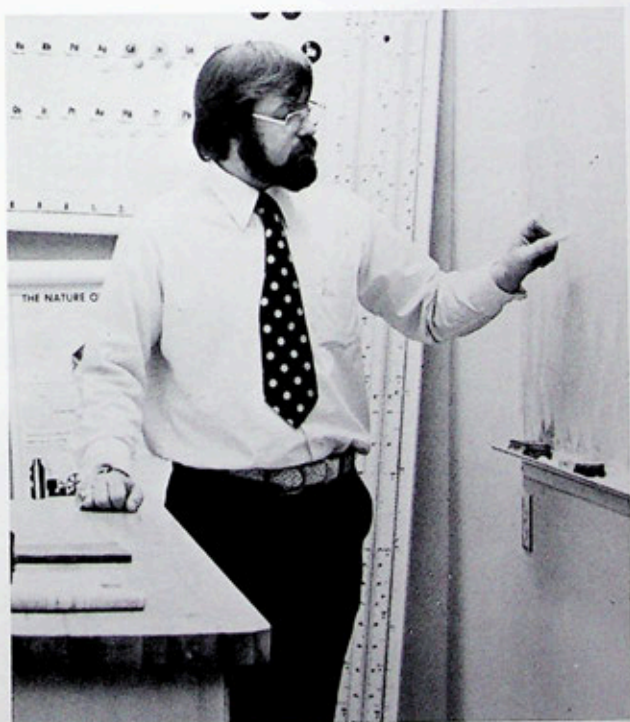
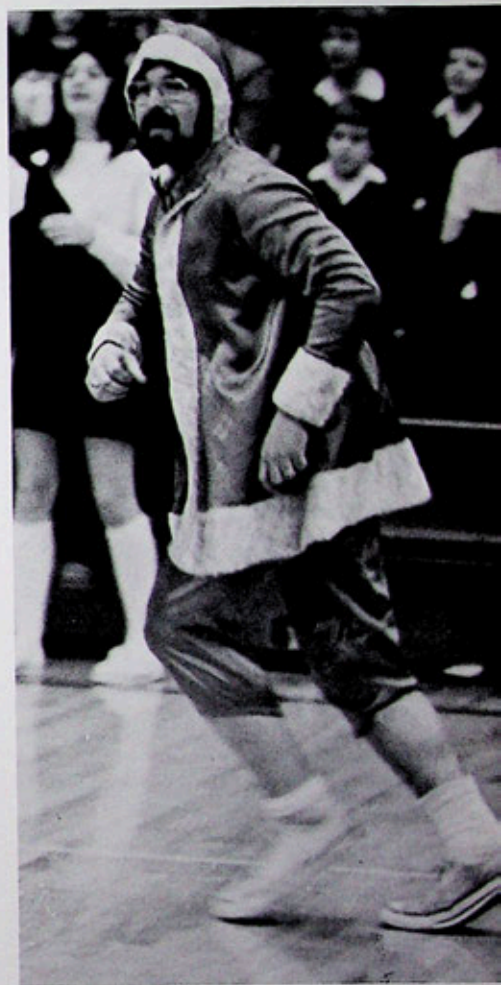
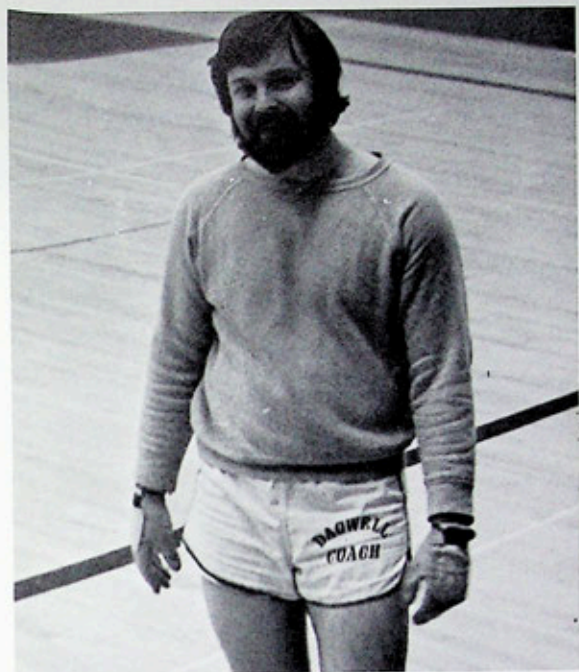

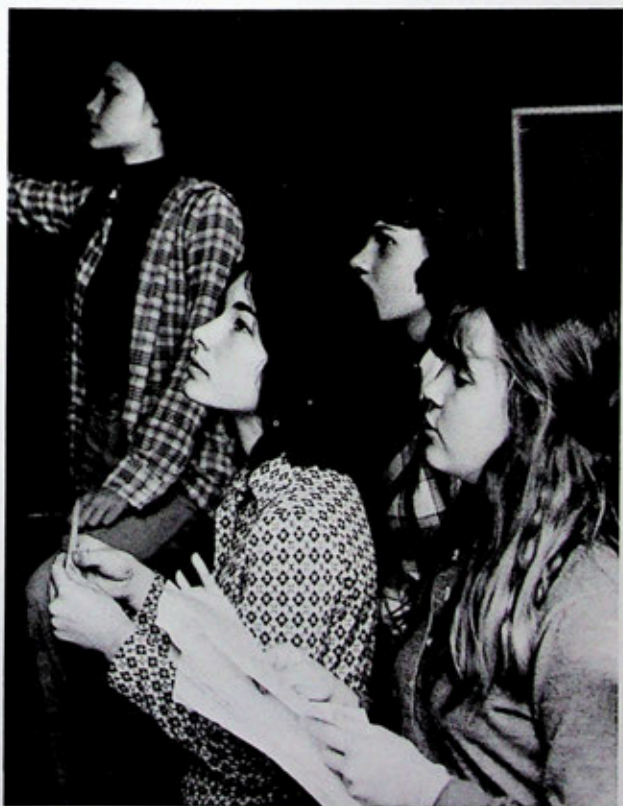






## Student Government
