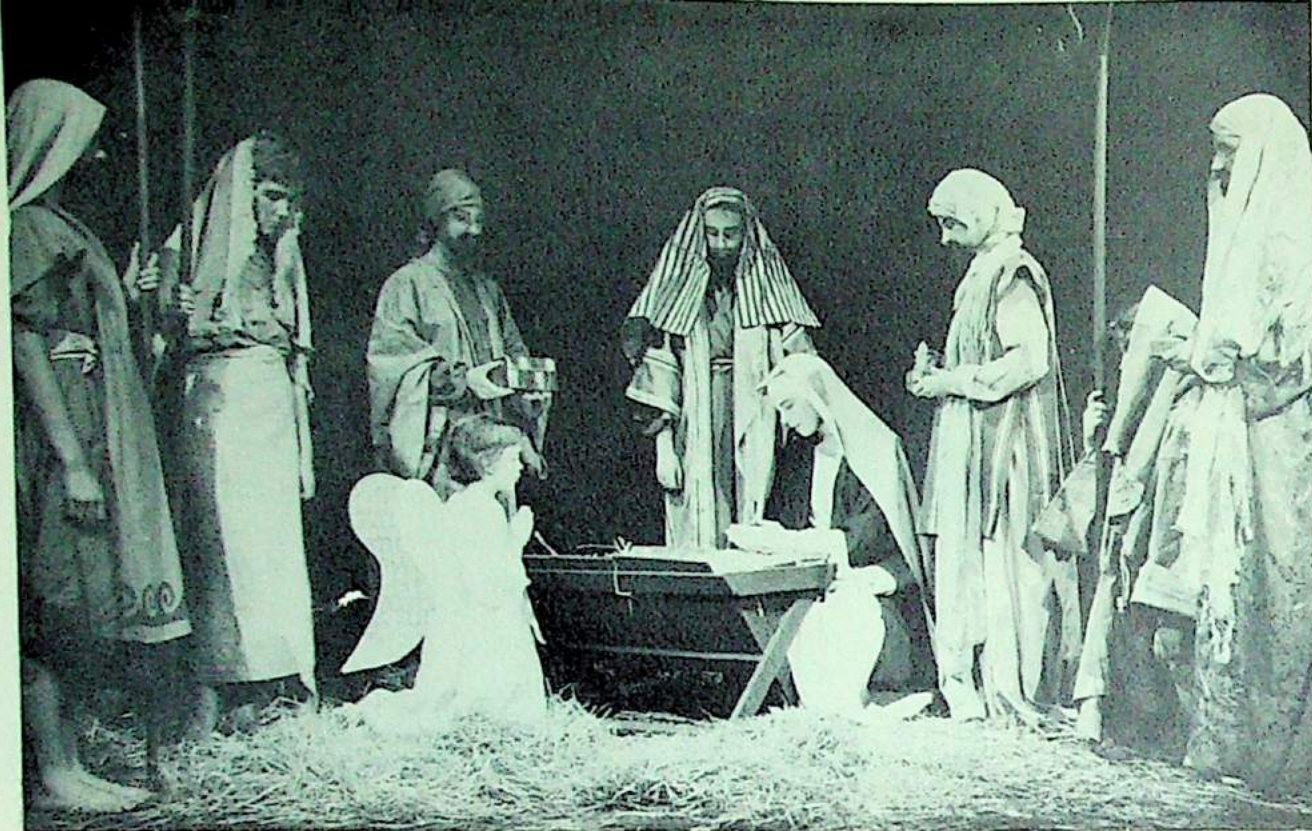




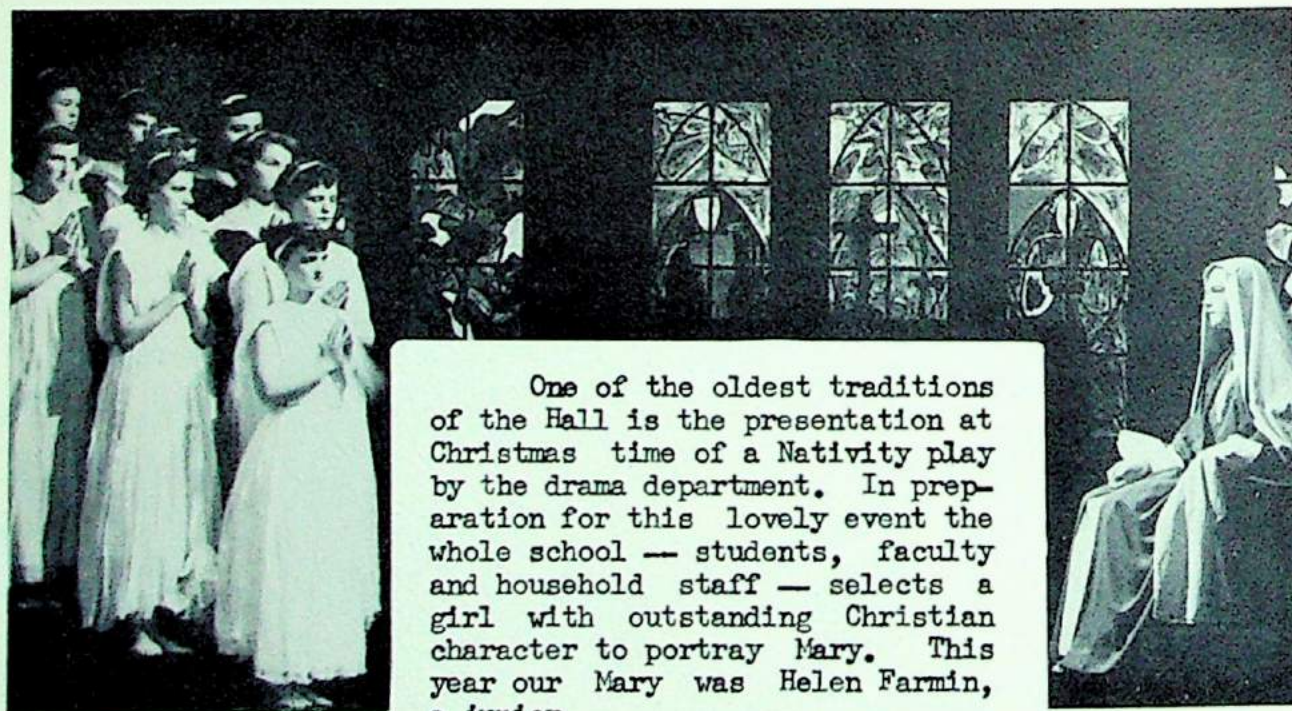
OLD GIRL - NEW GIRL TEA
