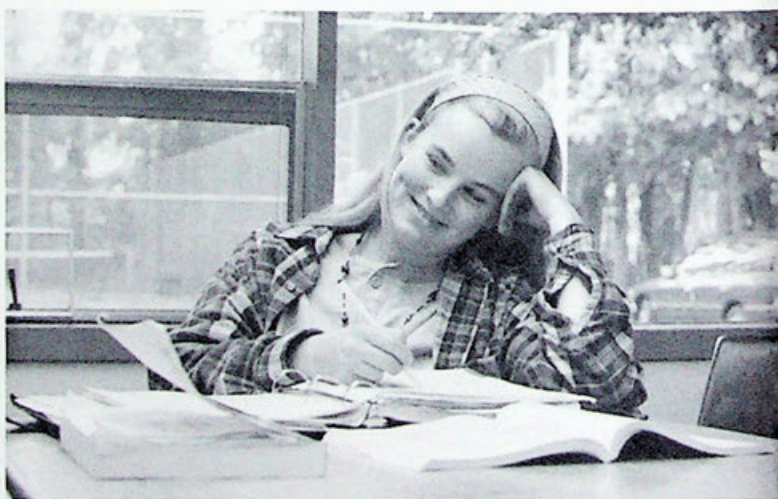


A Blast From The Past

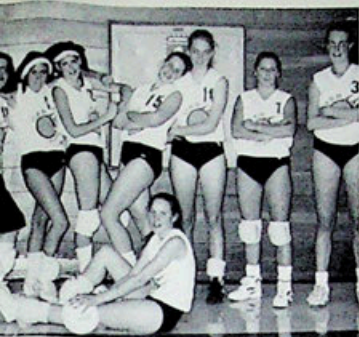

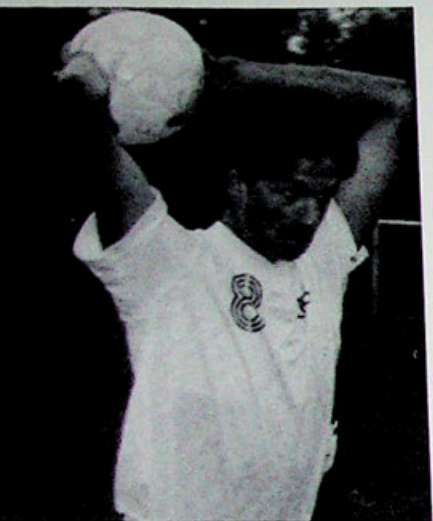

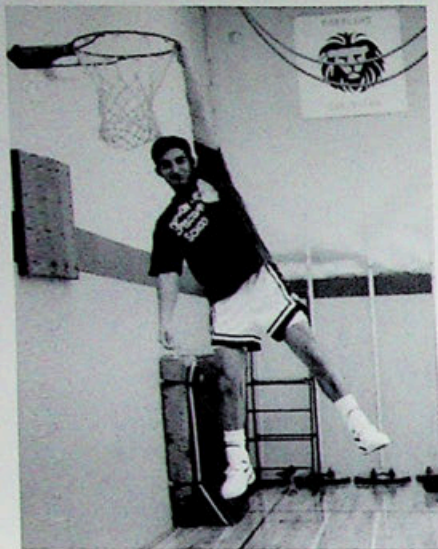
