# Seniors Start It Up

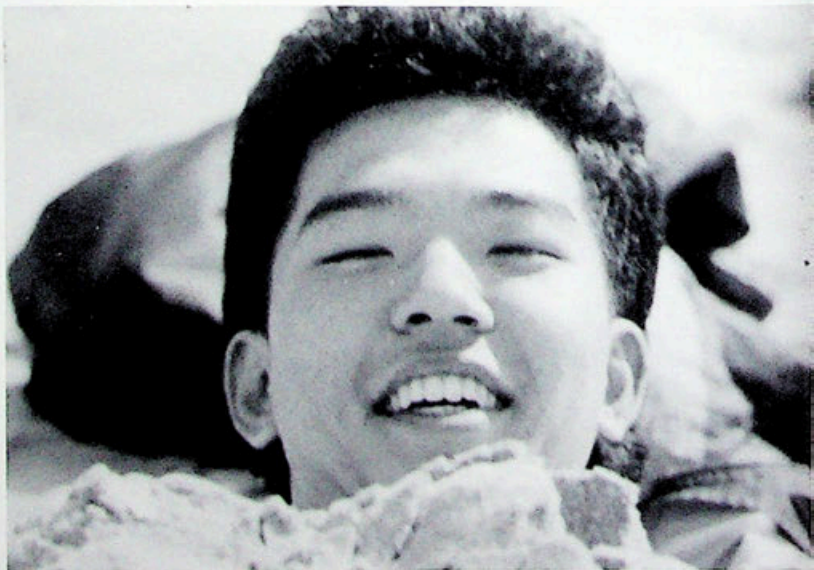

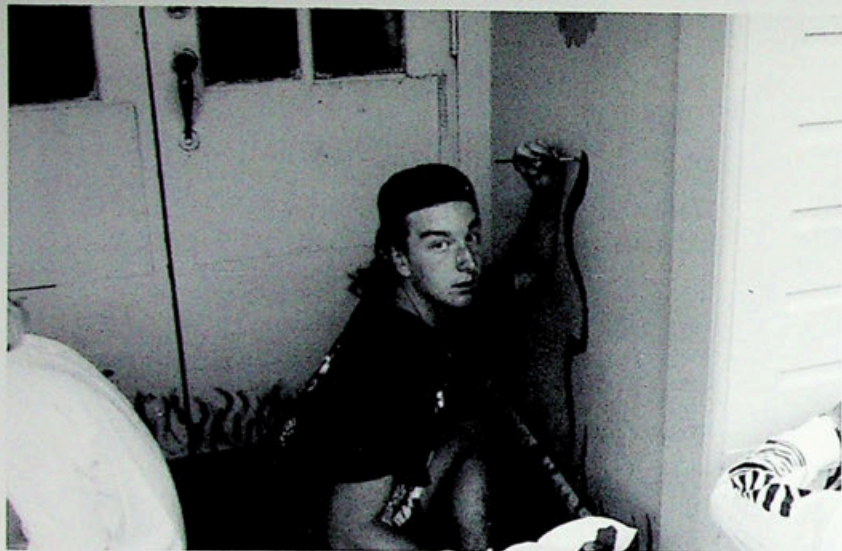

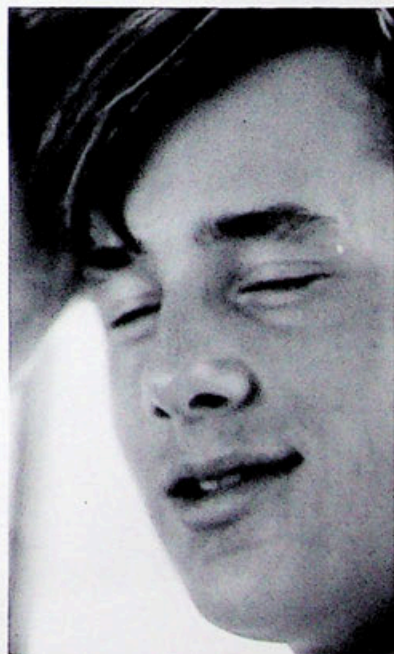

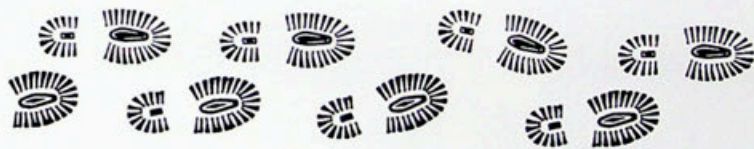

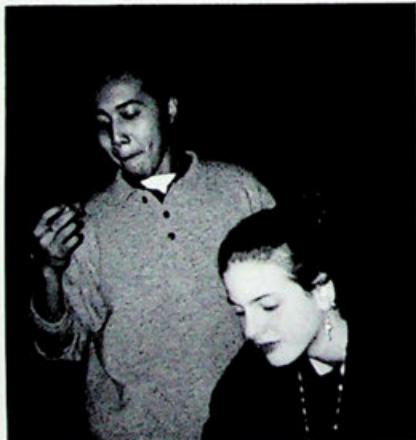

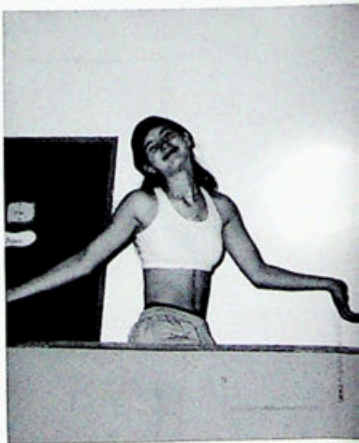

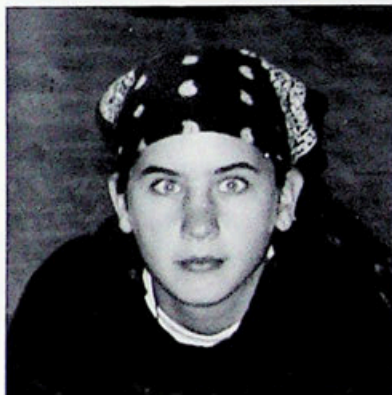

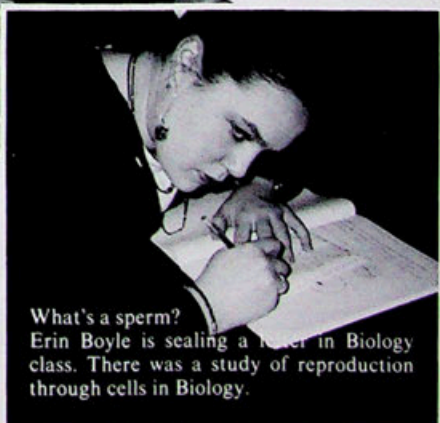

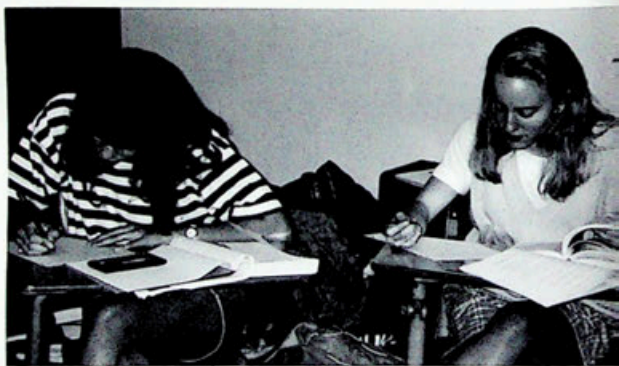


# Forays Into Foreign Language

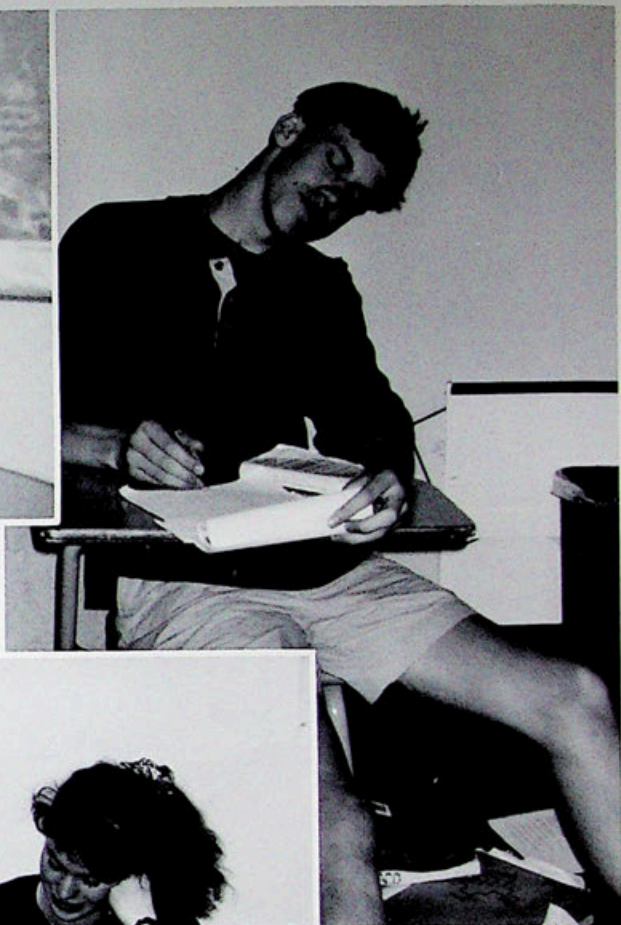

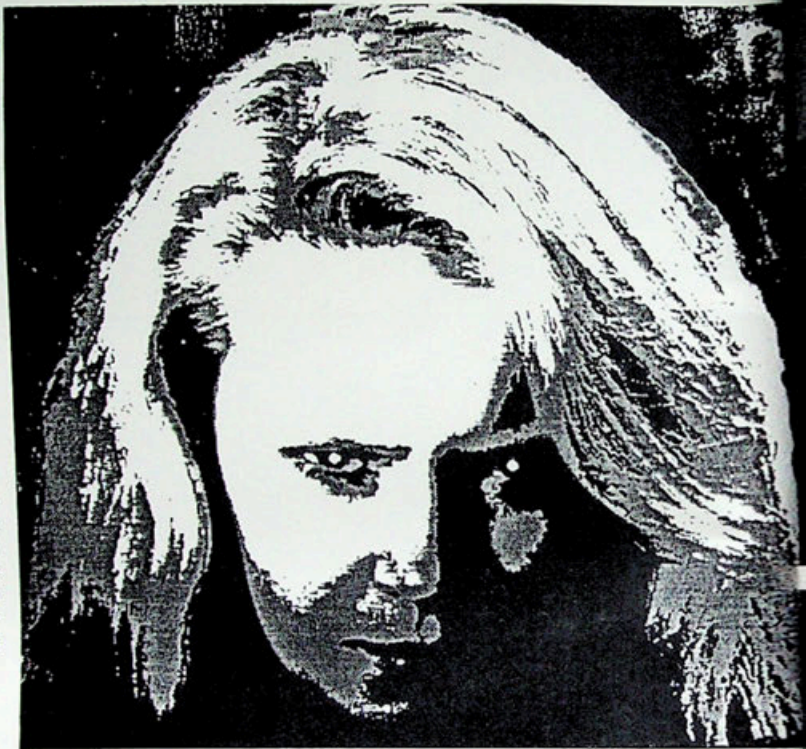

# The Children's Hour

The scene of the fall play is a small boarding school for "young ladies" around the 1930's. Commotion arises when a mischievous preteen snot, Mary Tilford, played by Cassie Langdale, accuses the headmistresses of the boarding school, Karen Wright and Martha Dobie (Lauren Meyer and Kirsten Winchell) of being homosexual. 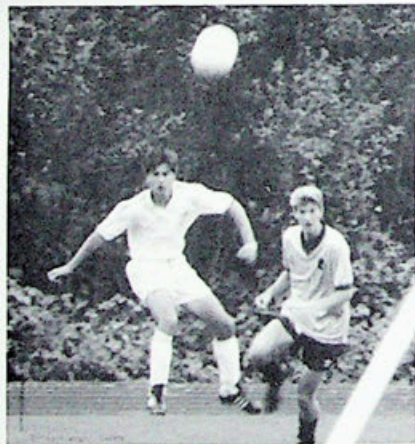

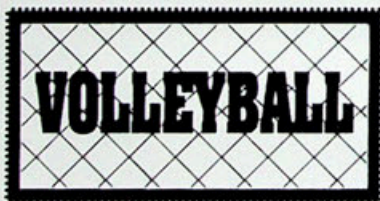

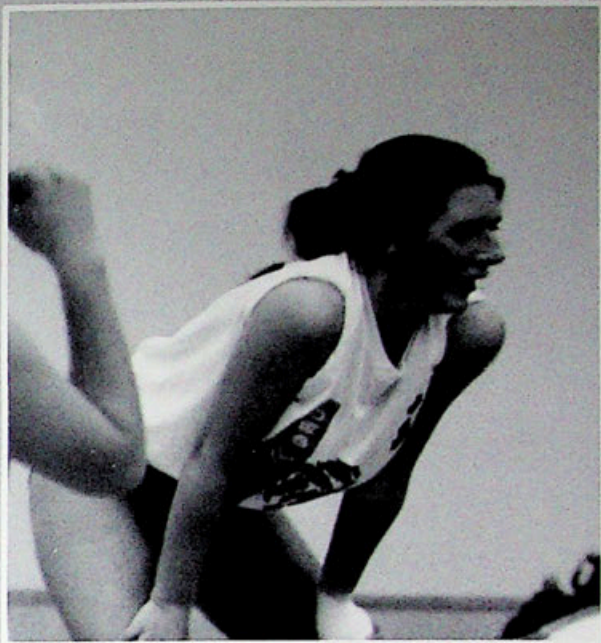

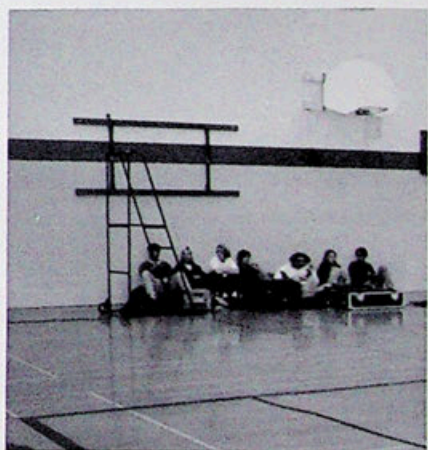

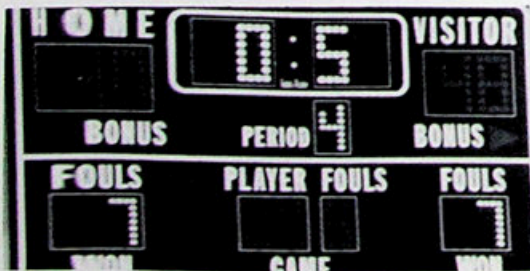

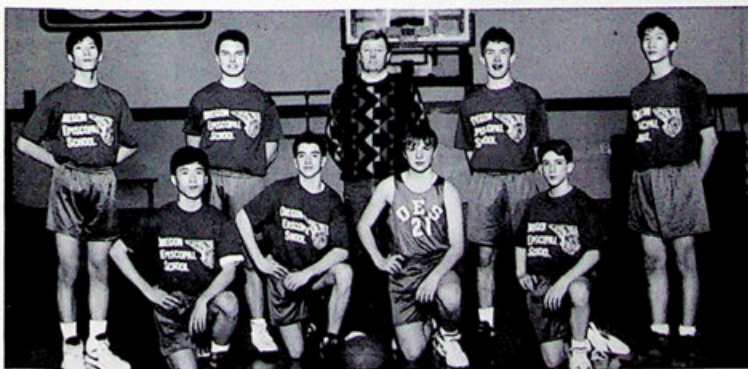

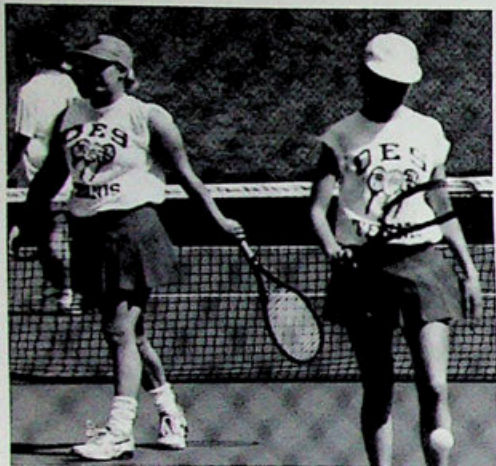

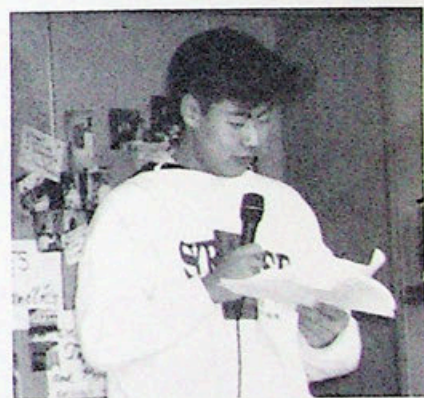
# Seniors Relax On The Deschutes

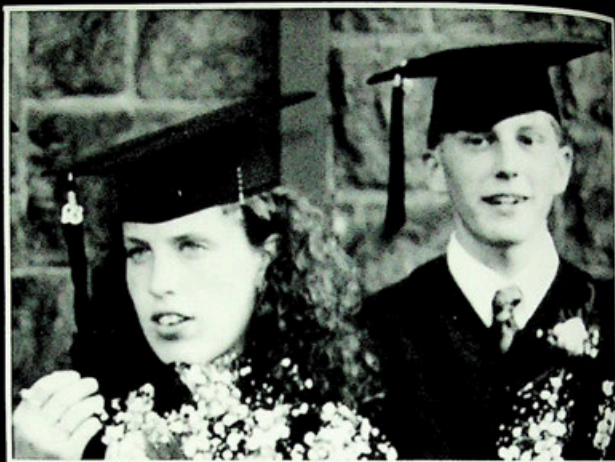






# The Final Countdown
